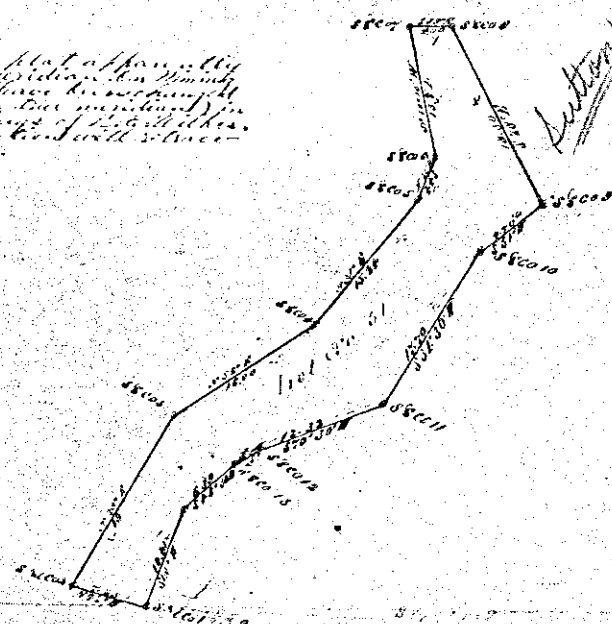


Elliott Bras

April 29, 1903, I saw these occurrences near longitude
20° 30' (thus close to the meridian) in
a barony with the fossils of a *Strophomena*
h. S. Surin in connection with other
insects at T. 12 S. R. 41 E.
