

NOTE TO TAXPAYERS

The Baker County Assessor and Sheriff have modernized their tax record system in order to make the office procedure more efficient and at the same time comply with a state-wide standard tax record system.

In order for you to benefit by improved and faster service at tax paying time, it is IMPORTANT that you bring the tax notices with you which cover the property upon which you wish to pay.

Notice that the far right hand column shows the net amount to be paid by those taking advantage of the 3% rebate. The full tax without the rebate deducted is shown in the third column from the right.

Most of the changes that will be noticeable to you, the taxpayer, have been made during the past year and are described for you below.

1. Account Number—Each parcel of real property in the county has been assigned an account number. It is shown on your statement just to the left of your name and address and should be used by you in all communications concerning your property either to the Assessor or Sheriff. This number consists of the map number plus a tax lot number. The map number consists of the township, range and section covering the area of the map. Each personal property account has also been assigned a number preceded by the letter "P."

2. Tax Lot Number—This number is part of the above mentioned account number and is the actual number assigned to your property in the area covered by the map. After this year this number will be used in lieu of other description for tax purposes as provided by Oregon Revised Statute 308.240. This number refers to a public record in the Assessor's office known as the "Official Tax Lot Record." This record shows a detailed description of your property as taken from your deed. The additional description shown on the enclosed tax statement is for your convenience in seeing what number has been assigned to your property. Please keep this information handy for reference in future years.

3. Code Number—Near the left of your name and also below in the left center is the code number which describes the taxing districts as a group which receive your tax money. You will find the breakdown of your code number by taxing districts. You may determine the amount of money going to each of these districts by multiplying the taxing district millage by the assessed value as shown on your tax statement.

DIRECTIONS FOR COMPUTING YOUR TAX

The above schedule may be used to compute the proportion of tax paid to the various levying bodies included under the Code number shown on your tax statement. Computation may be made by multiplying the valuation shown on the statement by the millage levy as shown opposite the name of each levying body in each particular Code. One mill represents 1/10th of a cent, so in order to express mills in terms of dollars, the decimal point in the millage rate has to be moved 3 places to the left.

EXAMPLE: If your code number is 5-1 and the taxable value is \$2,000, your tax breakdown would be as follows:

Rural School0111 X 2,000— 22.20
City of Baker0219 X 2,000— 43.80
School District No. 5J0191 X 2,000— 38.20
School District No. 5 (old bonds)0066 X 2,000— 13.20
