

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

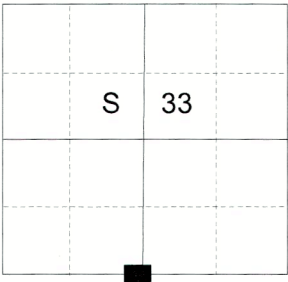
Corner originally established in GLO Contract No. 102, dated July 20, 1863, executed by Timothy Davenport. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set qr. sec post. Made mound of rock

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

No original corner evidence remains. Several fence corners fall in the area. A railroad tie fence corner, from which fences bears North and West were attested by long term landowner to be the in the position of the original corner, replacing a long standing split rail fence. Rails for original fence fall alongside.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position determined by survey, I set a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" aluminum cap, 27 inches in the ground, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

- A 15 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 40° East, a distance of 43.95 feet, marked 1/4 S33 BT.
- A 4 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 55° East, a distance of 16.25 feet, marked 1/4 S4 BT.
- An 8 inch Douglas Fir bears South 78° West, a distance of 37.15 feet, marked 1/4 S4 BT.
- A 22 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North, a distance of 7.5 feet, marked 1/4 S33 BT. Tree is used as a fence corner from which fences bears North, South and East.

Set steel fence post approx. 0.5 foot East.
