## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner was originally established by W. B. Barr under Contract No. 388 in August 1881. The original notes state that a marked basalt rock 20" x 18" x 6" was set from which:

A 24" Pine bears N 3° E 47 LK. A 6" Pine bears S 34° E 93 LK.

A 12" Fir bears N 73° W 26 LK.

A 6" Fir bears S  $70\frac{10}{2}$  W 45 LK.

No record of subsequent re-monumentation found in County Records.

Description of corner evidence found:


No evidence of original corner stone found.

A 19" Ponderosa Pine bears S 34° E for 62.0 feet with healed blaze. A stump hole for a 27" Ponderosa Pine snag bears N 3° E for 31.0 feet. A down 27" Ponderosa Pine snag bears S 71° W for 40 feet  $\pm$  with scribing T6S --- S3. A 28" Red Fir bears N 67½° W for 17.1 feet with healed blaze. A  $21\frac{1}{2}$ " Red Fir bears S  $70\frac{1}{2}$ ° W for 29.7 feet with healed blaze.

Description of monument and accessories Lastablished to perpetuate the original location of this corner. At the corner position I set a  $2^n \times 30^n$  iron pipe with brass cap 15" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of stones to within 6" of the cap marked:

## From which:

A 15" Red Fir bears N  $16\frac{1}{2}$ ° E for 40.8 feet, scribed T6S R43E S34 BT. The new BT has a lower blaze scribed BT with a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed flush. Attached sign 54–3 and painted a red ring around each BT. Set a steel fence post with a 54–4 sign attached near monument.
