Corner established by W. B. Barr under G L O contract No. 503, dated May 23, 1884.


Surveyor's General records state:

Corner REESTABLISHED by James D. Hanley in September, 1965.....

Set !" galvanized pipe with 2" aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram, 50.50 ft north of true corner location as reference monument.



Description of corner evidence found:

Original corner position destroyed by road construction.

Found aluminum cap monument as described above with small rock mound.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Improved surrounding rock mound around corner monument and set a 6 foot steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached.

New bearing trees established:

A ponderosa pine 12 ins dia bears  $N64^{\circ}E$ , 44.0 ft marked 1/4S36 BT. A ponderosa pine 15 ins dia bears  $N81^{\circ}W$ , 39.8 ft marked 1/4S35 BT.

Each new bearing tree has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze and has signs 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6 inch band of red paint.
