

A tamarack snago43 dins dia bears ${\rm N15}^{\rm O}{\rm W}$ 48 lks dist with visible scribes.

A fir 35 ins dia bears N45°E 53 lks dist with visible scribes.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 30" long 25" in ground with 5" proj. out of ground with surrounding rock mound and 6' steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached. Buried found stone alongside.

Aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

New bearing tree set:

A tamarack 12 ins dia bears N64°W 56.6 ft dist marked 4 S9 BT.

Each original bearing tree and each new bearing tree has signs 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6 in band of red paint, additionally each new bearing tree has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze.
