
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

In Survey 7-39-7, filed 1976, Hanley set a 5/8" rebar at true position.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 5/8" x 30" iron pin uprooted and bent. Original position indeterminate.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO MONUMENT THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position by Survey, I set a 5/8" x 30"iron pin, 26" in the ground, with 2 1/2" aluminum cap marked as shown below in a 2 foot collar of stone, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 5/8" x 15" iron pin bears South 47°15' West, a distance of 23.27 feet with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked S RP BGB SURVEY MARKER. A 5/8" x 15" iron pin bears North 57°13' West, a distance of 17.08 feet with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked N RP BGB SURVEY MARKER.


Buried pin alongside.

Set steel fence post approx. 0.5 feet West.

Falls approx. 12 feet South of fence corner to South/West bearing fence lines.
