
HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by County Surveyor Ira Hoffman in 1915. Survey Book 24, page 89 states:

Set a basalt stone 6x16x18, 15 in the ground, marked 1/16 on N. face.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found stone 6x16x18, marked "1/16" on North face.



DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position of the found stone, I set a 5/8"x 30" iron pin with 2½" aluminum cap marked as shown, 30 inches in the ground, from which;

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin bears South 8°13'34" East, a distance of 12.62 feet, with 1 ½" aluminum cap marked "S RP"

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin bears South 82°25'51" West, a distance of 15.53 feet, with 1 ½" aluminum cap marked "W RP"

I bury the original stone along the West side of the monument. Corner falls on the North side of an existing fence corner, fencelines run East/West and South.

I hereby certify that the corner was monumented on April 13, 2011.
