
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## History of original corner establishment:

W. B. Barr conducted the survey of Township 7 South, Range 43 East, W.M., August 29 to September 8, 1881, under GLO Contract No. 388, dated May 7, 1881.

The original notes of that survey relative to this corner state the following:

Marked a Basalt stone  $18^{n}$  c  $8^{n}$  x  $6^{n}$  for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. corner. Raised mound of rock as per instructions.



## Description of corner evidence found:

Found a Basalt stone 20" x 10" x 7" layed over in a large stone mound marked with  $\frac{1}{4}$  scratched on face.

## Description of manument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 2h" into the ground. Constructed a 36" dia. stone mound around the monument. Cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram. Buried the original corner stone to the North of the new monument. From the corner point:

A Basalt stone,  $2h'' \times 1h'' \times 12''$  pears N.  $75^{\circ}$  E., at 70.h ft. dist., mkd. X A Basalt stone,  $30'' \times 18'' \times 12''$  bears S.  $60^{\circ}$  W., at 87.8 ft. dist., mkd. X

Set a steel fence post 5 ft. South from the monument and attached a USFS 54-9 sign. Used  $18\frac{1}{2}$ 0 declination for the bearings to the BO's. Used a steel tape to measure to the X's of the bearing objects.

This corner was remonumented to USFS specifications on Dec. 1, 1986, witnessed by Tom Fisk and Larry McBroom.
