Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" alum. pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " alum. cap 24 ins. into the ground. Constructed a 36" dia. stone mound around the monument. The cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram.

From the corner point:
A 11" dia. White Fir bears N. 51° W. at 5.8 ft. dist., marked N 1/16 S 12 BT.

A 11" dia. White Fir bears S. 63° E. at 15.6 ft. dist., marked N 1/16 S 7 BT.

Set a steel fence post 4 ft. North of the monument and attached a USFS 54-2 sign. Set another steel fence post 4 ft. to the East and attached a USFS 54-2 and 54-9 signs. Painted the face of the blaze and a 6 in. band around the bearing trees red. I.D. washers were nailed between the scribed B and T of the new bearing trees. The washers are 3/4" in diameter and made of brass with PLS 1206 stamped on one side. Attached USFS 54-9 and 54-3 signs to the bearing trees. Used $18\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ declination on a staff compass for readings to the bearing trees. Used a steel tape to measure to a nail set in the side of the trees.

This corner was monumented to USFS specifications on July 31, 1987, witnessed by Tom Fisk and Andy Marlette.
