Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" alum. pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " alum. cap 26" into the ground. Constructed a 36" stone mound around the monument. The cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram.

From the corner point:

Ponderosa Pine, 18 ins. dia., bears S. 48° E., at 45.0 ft. dist., mkd. N 1/16 S 20 BT.

Douglas Fir, 12 ins. dia., bears S. 36° W., at 54.3 ft. dist., mkd. N 1/16 S 19 BT.

Set a steel fence post 4 ft. from the monument and attached a USFS 54-9 sign. Painted the face of the blaze and a 6 in. band around the bearing trees red. I.D. washers were nailed between the scribed B and T of the new bearing trees. The washers are 3/4" in diameter and made of brass with PLS 1206 stamped on one side. Attached USFS 54-9 and 54-3 signs to bearing trees. Used $18\frac{1}{2}$ declination on a staff compass for readings to bearing trees. Used a steel tape to measure to a nail set in the side of the base of the bearing tree trunks.

This corner was monumented to USFS specifications on December 19, 1986, witnessed by Tom Fisk and Larry McBroom.
