

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION


History of original corner establishment:

Corner established by W. B. Barr under GLO contract no. 443 dated May 29, 1882.

Surveyor General records state:

Set volcanic rock 12 x 10 x 9 ins 8 ins in the ground for 1/4 sec cor marked 1/4 on the west side from which:

A quaking aspen 3 ins in diam bears S 43° E, 90 lks dist marked 1/4 S BT
A quaking aspen 5 ins in diam bears S 10° W, 87 lks dist marked 1/4 S BT



Description of corner evidence found:

An ancient fence corner from which the fence runs north and west.


Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a 2½ inch brass cap on a 1 inch iron pipe 31 inches long and projecting 5 inches out of the ground with a surrounding rock mound.

Brass cap marked thus:
