I SET A NEW REFERENCE POINT:

► A 5/8"x 30" iron pin, driven flush, bears S.59°E., 15.58 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked RP 1 2022 PLS 69454

Painted a 6 inch red band around the bearing trees, and also painted blazes red. Bearings measured with a staff compass with 14° East declination. Distances measured with a steel tape, measuring to a 60d nail driven in the side-center-right at the root crown of all three BT's, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer marked *PLS 69454*. Attached new USFS 54-3 signs to BT's with updated information, and attached USFS 54-9 sign to new BT.
