History of original comer establishment:

Corner was originally established under GLO contract number 707, by Williard B. Blakeslee on June 15, 1901. Surveyor General's notes state: "Set a basalt stone 14 x 8 x 4 ins., 10 ins. in the grad. for the cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 & 17, marked with 4 notches on the S. & E. faces, raised a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 24 ins. high, 10 lks. W. of the cor."

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 14 \times 8 \times 4 inch basalt stone, firmly set, with 4 notches on S. and E. faces. Remains of mound of stone 6 ft. West.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this comer:

At the center of the above point, set $2\ 1/2" \times 30"$ galvanized pipe and brass cap marked as shown: Set pipe 24" in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. Buried marked stone alongside of the pipe.

from which by magnetic declination of N20°E:

A 15" pine bears S39°E., 338.7 ft., scribed T7S, R47E, S16 BT. No other trees. Built 3 ft. x 3 ft. mound of stone 5 ft. north of the corner.

Painted blazes red and 6" red band around. Placed 54-3s, 54-4s and brass washers stamped PLS 1051 on the BT. Placed 54-2 and 54-4 on a steel fence post 5 ft. south and placed 54-2 on a steel fence post 5 ft. east of the corner.
