History of original corner establishment:

Both marked B.T.R. 5-477.

The corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick under Mineral Survey No. 477, during June and July 1902. The original notes state that at the corner a scribed black pine post 4' long by 4" sq. was set 12" in the ground from which:

Description of corner evidence found: Found a mound of stone and rotted remains of the post at ground level in the mound from which:

A 15" western larch stump with catface bears S28°E-12.4' (original bearing tree).

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 30" aluminum pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 24" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of stone from which:

A 7" white fir bears S26½ E-25.1' scribed 5-R-477 BT. A 10" white fir bears N70½ E-17.9' scribed 5-R-477 BT. New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to the face of blaze. Attached signs 54-9 and 54-3 to each bearing tree and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fence posts on National Forest Boundary NE of corner and attached sign 54-9 to one post and sign 54-2 to both posts. Cap is marked:

Used steel tape and staff compass with 20°E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on July 25, 1985.
