

**SUBSEQUENT SURVEYS:** Corner maintenance activities performed October 4, 1984 by William L. Hanley, PLS #1639, as evidenced by the Certified Record of Land Corner Monumentation filed June 11, 1985, as Baker County Survey No. 8-37-4



**ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION:** Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 27 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 30 only, with brass cap marked (diagram shown) from which

A balsam, 8 ins. dia., bears N. 37  $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 90 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 30 BT. A balsam, 6 ins. dia., bears S. 85° E., 50 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 30 BT.

HANLEY'S DESCRIPTION: Brass cap found as per official record and marked as shown in diagram.

A fir 12 ins. diam., bears S 85° E., 50 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

No trace of other bearing tree.

Improved surrounding rock mound around corner monument and set a 6 foot steel fence post alongside with a sign 54-9 attached.

New bearing tree:

A pine 12 ins. diam. bears N 63° E 17.4 ft. marked 1/4 S30 BT, with a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze.

**EVIDENCE FOUND:** Found 1" iron pipe with  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, marked as shown below, firmly set and projecting 1" above ground in a 2.5 ft. diameter mound of stone, with a steel fence post with attached USFS 54-9 sign set westerly, 4 ft. from the found monument.

### From which:

► A lodgepole pine, 15" dbh, bears N.61°E., 17.4 ft., with visible scribing in a partially healed double blaze (Hanley BT). All other bearing trees are dead and down.

## DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

I accept the position of the found monument for the corner.


#### From which, I SCRIBE A NEW BEARING TREE:

► An Engelmann spruce, 13" dbh, bears N.18  $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 32.95 ft. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ S30 in upper blaze, and BT in lower blaze.

### Also from which, I SET NEW REFERENCE POINTS:

- ► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, bears S.39°W., 9.56 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 1 2023 PLS 69454*
- ► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, bears N.25°W., 21.28 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 2 2023 PLS 69454*

CORNER MONUMENT MARKED:



Painted a 6 inch red band around each bearing tree, and also painted the blazes red. Attached USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs to BT's. Used a staff compass with  $14^{\circ}$  East declination to measure bearings to accessories. Used an EDM device to measure distances to accessories. Distances to BT's were measured to a 60d nail driven in the side-center at the root crown of the tree, with an attached  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped PLS 69454.
