
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner established by Lincoln E. Wilkes under instructions dated Sept. 24,1923 and included in Group No. 107.

Surveyor General records state:

...set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 27 ins. in the ground, for 2 sec. cor. of sec. 25 only, with brass cap marked as shown in diagram



from which:
A black pine, 6 ins. dia., bears S. 21° W., 28½ lks. dist., marked ½ S 25 BT.
A black pine, 6 ins. dia., bears N. 32½° W., 30½ lks. dist., marked ½ S 25 BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

A brass cap on an iron pipe marked as shown in corner diagram.

A 14" pine log and stump bears N 3220 W, 302 kks. dist. wash healed blaze. A 13" pine snag bears S 210 W., 282 lks dist with fragmentary scribes visible.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

Improved surrounding rock mound around corner monument and set a 6 foot steel fence post alongside with a sign 54-9 attached.

New bearing trees:

A fir 7 inches diam bears N 63° W., 41.5 ft. dist. marked \$ \$ 25 BT. A fir 8 inches diam bears N 09° E., 27.9 ft. dist. marked \$ \$ 25 BT.

Each new bearing has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze.

To each bearing tree altached a sign 54-3 above BT blaze and below a 6 inch band of red paint and a sign 54-9 attached to opposite side of the from BT blaze.
