

ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: A blk pine post 5 ft long $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square 12" in the ground with mound of stone around it marked Cor No. 1 VPC. a tamarack 30" Dia blazed and marked Cor 1 VPC bears N.73°25'E. 16L dist (10.6 ft.)

G.L.O. DESCRIPTION: To cor. No. 2, common with cor. No. 1, Victor Claim, same survey, as determined by reference to the stump of the bearing tree, described as "A tamarack, 30 ins. dia., bears N.73°25'E., 16 lks. dist. marked C O R N 2 E P - 1 4 B T. I find no trace of mound of stone, or original post. Agreeing with the bearing tree, I set an iron pipe $1\frac{1}{4}$ ins. dia., $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. in the ground.


MYER'S 2016 SURVEY:

Myers found and accepted Mitchell's brass cap monument for the corner

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found Mitchell's unrecorded monument, which is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, marked as shown below, projecting 6" from a 3 ft. diameter mound of stone. I also found a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe, of unknown origin, set northeast and alongside Mitchell's brass cap monument. I believe the pipe was set sometime after Mitchell's 1981 remonumentation, as Mitchell makes no mention of it in his description of the found evidence. From the found brass cap monument, I found the following bearing trees:

- ► A western larch stump, 30" diameter, 1 ft. tall, with lower portion of blaze, bears N.71°E., 10.5 ft. (original BT)
- ► A western larch, 18" dbh, bears N.10°W., 1.62 ft. (Mitchell BT)
- A rootwad hole, bears S.60°E., 2.6 ft., with an 8" diameter dead and down white fir laying alongside, with partially healed blaze and visible scribing (Mitchell BT)

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

I accept Mitchell's brass cap monument as a faithful and accurate perpetuation of the original corner, being harmoniously related to the original accessory evidence, and also to other found accepted corners of Mineral Survey 194 based on the G.L.O. record.

I dug down 12" below grade and cut off the found unrecorded iron pipe. I removed Mitchell's monument, and in it's place I set a standard USFS $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with attached $3\frac{1}{4}$ " aluminum cap, 24" in the ground. Built a 3 ft. diameter mound of stone to top. Cap is marked as shown below. I cut Mitchell's monument in half, and deposited it along with the unrecorded pipe in the mound.

From which, I SET A NEW REFERENCE POINT:

► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, bears N.59°26'E., 23.88 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked RP 1 2023 PLS 69454

Placed a blue plastic-encased magnet at the base of the aluminum pipe. Painted a 6 inch red band around the live bearing tree, painted the healed blaze red, and attached new USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs. Distance to live bearing tree measured to a Mag Spike driven in the side-center-right at the base of the tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped *PLS 69454*. Distance to original bearing tree stump measured to face of blaze. Bearings are geodetic, derived by GPS observation at the corner. Set an aluminum guard post N.50°E., 5 ft., with USFS signs 54-2 and 54-9 attached, and set another one S.41°W., 8 ft., with USFS sign 54-2 attached.
