



EVIDENCE FOUND: Found Mitchell's unrecorded monument, which is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, marked as shown, projecting 3" above ground in a 3 ft. diameter mound of stone. From which,


- ► A white fir stump, 40"± diam. and 6 ft. tall, broken and decayed, bears N.80°E, 20 ft., measured to an open blaze with scribing COR No 2 and 15 legible among other fragmentary scribing (Original BT)
- ► A white fir snag, 9½" dbh, bears S.80°E., 9.9 ft., with fully-healed single blaze (Mitchell BT)
- ► A western larch, 12" dbh, bears S.70°W., 6.14 ft., with fully-healed single blaze (Mitchell BT)
- Corner No. 1 Willamette Placer Claim, MS 191, monumented with an unrecorded $1\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, established by John R. Mitchell, bears N.34°W., 2.86 ft.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED: I accept Mitchell's brass cap monument as a faithful and accurate perpetuation of the original corner, being harmoniously related to the found accessory evidence, and to other found accepted corners in the area.

From which, I SCRIBE A NEW BEARING TREE:

▶ A western larch, $9\frac{1}{2}$ " dbh, bears S.03°W., 16.41 ft. marked X in upper blaze, and XBT in lower blaze.

CORNER MONUMENT MARKED:



Painted a 6 inch red band around the bearing trees, and also painted the blazes red, and attached new USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs. Distances to live BT's measured with a steel tape to a Mag Spike driven in the side-center-right at the root crown of each tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped *PLS 69454*. Used a magnetic compass with 14° East declination to measure bearings to BT's. Set an aluminum guard post S.35°W., 4.4 ft. with USFS 54-2 and 54-9 signs attached. See associated Map of Survey dated August 20, 2025 for survey-related information.
