



EVIDENCE FOUND: Found Mitchell's unrecorded monument, which is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, marked as shown, projecting 4" above the top of a 2 ft. diameter mound of stone. From which,

- ► Rotten remains of a stump, size and species indeterminate, bears N.58°E, 18 ft. (MS 181 BT)
- ► A white fir, 33" dbh, bears N.38°30'W., 14.26 ft., with healed single blaze (Original BT)
- ► A Douglas-fir, 23" dbh, bears N.16°30'W., 21.92 ft., with fully-healed single blaze (Mitchell BT)

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED: I accept Mitchell's brass cap monument as a faithful and accurate perpetuation of the original corner, being harmoniously related to the found accessory evidence, and to other found accepted corners in the area.

Painted a 6 inch red band around each bearing tree, and also painted healed blazes red, and attached new USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs. Distances measured with a steel tape to a Mag Spike driven in the side-center-right at the root crown of each tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped *PLS 69454*. Used RTK GPS to measure bearings. Bearings are geodetic, based on GPS observation taken at the corner. See associated Map of Survey dated August 20, 2025 for survey-related information.
