

MINERAL SURVEY 181 DESCRIPTION: To corner No. 4 which is a black pine post 5 ft long 4 ½" square set 12" in the ground with a mound of stone around it marked corner Cor No. 4. NPMC S No 181. This corner is identical with corner No. 3 of the Excelsior Mining Claim Survey No. 16 and identical with corner No. 4 of location and from which a Fir 15" Dia bears N.15°10'W 23 ft dist. blazed and marked Cor No. 4. NPMC S No. 181 B.T. a Fir 11" Dia bears S.36°35'E 26 ft dist. blazed and marked Cor No. 4. NPMC S No. 181 B.T.

MINERAL SURVEY 242 DESCRIPTION: To Cor. No. 5, identical with Cor. 3 Excelsior Claim and Cor. 4 North Pole Claim, which is a post $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long 4 inches square, set 12 inches in the ground, with mound of stone, mark it on West face Cor. 5 R.R.Q.C. M.S. 242, from which


EVIDENCE FOUND: The corner falls in an area which has undergone substantial earthwork from mining activity. I did find a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter by 30" iron pipe, with 2" diameter plumbing cap attached, laying on the ground near the corner. The pipe is similar to others which have been found and accepted at other mineral corners in the area, but I could not determine the exact spot from which it came. After a diligent search, I found no other remaining evidence of the original corner. I declare this corner lost, and reestablish its position by implementing the Grant Boundary Adjustment method, as described in Section 7-54 of the 2009 B.L.M. Manual of Surveying Instructions. I held the found monuments at Corner No.'s 1 and 3 of North Pole Claim for the adjustment. This position is harmoniously related to other found accepted monuments in the area. The position is also within 2 feet of where I found the iron pipe on the ground.




DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED: At the corner point as determined by survey, I set a standard USFS $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with attached $3\frac{1}{4}$ " aluminum cap, 20" in the ground. Raised a 3 ft. diameter mound of stone around the monument to top of cap. Cap is marked as shown below.

From which, I SET NEW REFERENCE POINTS:

- ► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, bears N.44°42'E., 19.37 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 1 2025 PLS 69454*
- ► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, bears S.44°49'E., 20.11 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 2 2025 PLS 69454*

CORNER MONUMENT MARKED:



Placed a plastic-encased magnet at the base of the aluminum pipe. Deposit found iron pipe west and alongside the monument. Used RTK GPS to measure accessories. Bearings are geodetic, based on GPS observation taken at the corner. Set an aluminum guard post NORTH 5 ft. 54-9 sign attached. See associated Map of Survey dated August 20, 2025 for survey-related information.
