

ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: A pine post 4 ft. long, 4 ins square, set 18 ins in the ground, surrounded with a mound of earth, scribed Homestake N.E. end cen. M.S. 514 Identical with location N.E. end cen. post. From which

A pine 6 ins in diam, bears S74°05'E 10.7 ft. dist. blazed & scribed Homestake M.S. 514-B.T.

MITCHELL'S 1981 DESCRIPTION:

DESCRIBE CORNER MONUMENT FOUND: Rotting post in md stone & earth

DESCRIBE BEARING TREES OR OTHER OFFICIAL ACCESSORIES FOUND: Dead L.P.P. brs S74°E 10.7' w/ scribing in P.h.b. MONUMENT: DESCRIBE NEW MONUMENT SET, OR WORK DONE TO PRESERVE EXISTING MONUMENT: Set 2½" B.C. on 1"x32" gal. pipe 24" deep in original hole & md of stone marked HS NEC MS 514 JRM 1981 & Angle. ACCESSORIES: DESCRIBE NEW BT'S WITNESS OBJECTS ETC. ESTABLISHED, OR WORK DONE TO PRESERVE EXISTING EVIDENCE: 8" WF brs. N55°W 23', 7" WF brs. S24°W 15½' both marked HS NEC MS 514 BT

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found Mitchell's unrecorded monument, which is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, marked as shown below, projecting 4" above ground in a 2 ft. diameter mound of stone. From which, I found the original bearing tree:

► A lodgepole pine stump (broken off) with rotted remains of the bole laying alongside, with pitched-over negative of blaze with scribing *HOMESTAKE* legible, and with other fragmentary scribe marks, bears S.74°E., 10.7 ft. Also from which, Mitchell's bearing trees:

- ► A dead and down white fir bears N.55°W., 23 ft., with healed blaze.
- ► A dead and down white fir bears S.24°W., 15.5 ft., with healed blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

I accept the found brass-capped monument as the best available evidence of the original corner.

From which, I SCRIBE A NEW BEARING TREE:

► A lodgepole pine, 12" dbh, bears S.39°W., 36.0 ft. marked *HS NEC 514* in upper blaze, and *XBT* in lower blaze.

Also from which, I SET A NEW REFERENCE POINT:

► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, bears N.32°17'E., 46.13 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 1 2023 PLS 69454*

Painted a 6 inch red band around the bearing tree, painted the blazes red, and attached USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs. Used a staff compass with 14° East declination to measure bearings to BT's. Distance to new bearing tree was measured with a steel tape to a 60d nail driven in the side-center-right at the root crown of the tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped PLS 69454. Used a total station to measure the reference point. Set aluminum post S.50°E., with USFS signs 54-2 and 54-9 attached, and set another one N.50°W., with USFS sign 54-2 attached. See associated Map of Survey dated October 17, 2023 for survey-related information.
