Baker County Survey No. 8-40-14 states: "PK Nail set by Ba. Co. Sur. No. 8-40-6 was not found. Set MAG nail this survey."

Description of corner evidence found:

Found MAG nail set by Baker County Survey No. 8-40-14.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of the corner:

The corner was reestablished at the position of the said MAG nail. Set a 5/8" x 30" rebar with yellow plastic cap marked "HANLEY ENGR.PLS 1817", approximately 1" below asphalt surface.


