The original notes state: Set Post 4 feet long, 4 in. in dia. 1 foot in ground, raised mound and trench as per instructions, for Cor. to Secs. 14, 15, 22, & 23.

Description of corner evidence found:

An extensive search was made for the original post. No original corner evidence found. Found a drilled nail at fence intersection. Fences run South and West from fence intersection. See Narrative for Baker County Survey No. 8-42-15 for explanation of the origin of the drilled nail

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of the corner:

The corner was reestablished at position occupied by said drilled nail. Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter brass cap on a 1" x 30" galvanized pipe. The cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram.

Corner monument references:

Four 1" \times 2½" magnets encased in plastic were set 1' below the ground. From the corner monument:

A silver magnet marked "1" bears N. 45° 26' E., 11.31'

A pink magnet marked "2" bears S. 34° 09' E., 11.63'

A blue magnet marked "3" bears S. 47° 23' W., 13.35'

A orange magnet marked "4" bears N. 47° 14' W., 13.11'

Reference survey and basis of bearing: Baker County Survey No. 8-42-15.
