Description of corner evidence found:

An extensive search was made for the original post. No original corner evidence found. Found a drilled nail at fence intersection. Fences run North, South, and West from fence intersection. The drilled nail was set during the survey for Baker County Partition Plat No. P1996-005.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of the corner:

The corner was reestablished at position occupied by said drilled nail. Set a 21/2" diameter brass cap on a 1" x 30" galvanized pipe. The cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram.

Corner monument references:

Four 1" x 2½" magnets encased in plastic were set 1' below the ground. From the corner monument:

A silver magnet marked "1" bears N. 48° 14' E., 28.67' A pink magnet marked "2" bears S. 52° 31' E., 25.07' A blue magnet marked "3" bears S. 55° 20' W., 23.25' A orange magnet marked "4" bears N. 49° 07' W., 18.81'
