
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

DIAGRAM

History of original corner establishment:

The original corner was set by J.H. Stone, Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 235, dated July 6, 1875.

The original notes state: Set Post 4 feet long, 4 in. in dia. 1 foot in ground, and raised mound and trench as per instructions for 1/4 Sec. Cor.



Description of corner evidence found:

An extensive search was made for the original post. No original corner evidence found,

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of the corner:

The corner was reestablished at a fence intersection. Fences run Northwest, West, South, and East from fence intersection. Set a 21/2" diameter brass cap on a 1" x 30" galvanized pipe, approximately 10" above ground in the Northwest corner of a rock jack. The cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram.

Corner monument references: From the corner monument:

A 5/8" x 15" rebar with yellow plastic cap marked "HANLEY ENGR. PLS 1817" set approximately 4" below ground, bears N. 0° 18' 55" E., 18.89'.

A 5/8" x 30" rebar with yellow plastic cap marked "HANLEY ENGR. PLS 1817" set approximately 2" below ground, bears S. 88° 24' 54" E., 15.98'.

A 5/8" x 15" rebar with yellow plastic cap marked "HANLEY ENGR. PLS 1817" set approximately 6" below ground, bears S. 2° 45' 54" W., 14.12'.

A 5/8" x 15" rebar with yellow plastic cap marked "HANLEY ENGR. PLS 1817" set approximately 6" below ground, bears N. 89° 43' 16" W., 13.00'.

Reference survey and basis of bearing: Baker County Survey No. 8-42-15.
