

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION



This corner originally established by W.B. Barr under contract dated 1881.
Set 16 X 14 X 6 in. stone for 4 sec. corner.
Raised mound of rock as per instructions.

In August 1974 a remonumentation of original corners was done by the B.L.M.: They set a 2 1/2" X 28". brass capped steel pipe 20" in the ground in a mound of stone from which



A Ponderosa Pine, 22 in diam. bears N24 E 93 1ks. dist., mkd. ½S11 BT
A_Twin Ponderosa Pine, 21 in. diam. bears N2 E 163 1ks. dist.; mkd. ½S10 BT

Description of corner evidence found:

At the corner I found the brass cap as set by the B.L.M. in 1974. A 24" Ponderosa Pine bears N24[©]E 61.4 ft. mkd. ½SII BT The Twin **Po**nderosa Pine as set by the B.L.M. has blown down.

Brass cap stamped as shown:

T8S R 44E S10 | S11 1974

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

To replace the Twin Ponderosa Pine set by the B.L.M.

A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears N6⁰W 171.44 ft. mkd. ¹4810 BT Nail in E base.

Bearing taken with a staff compass declination 18 1/2° East per 1980 Isogonic chart

Distances are pulled to a 60d nail with brass washer stamped L.S. 1898 driven in the side center of bearing trees.
