
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Original survey executed in Sept. 1890 by Emil F. Voigt under instructions dated Aug. 29, 1980.

Set post 4½' long, 4" square, 12" in ground with mound of stone marked "ULS 2 S220" from which:

A rock 28"x32" base, 23" above ground marked with a cross bears S84E 55.0'
A rock 30"x18" 16", above ground bears N61E 51.0' marked with a cross.



Description of corner evidence found:

Found original rock pile.


Found original bearing objects:

28" x 32" rock 23" above ground with "X" S.84°E. 55.0' $30" ext{ x}^{\prime}18"$ rock 16" above ground with "X" N.61°E. 51.0'

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set 30" long aluminum pipe with 3½" aluminum cap, marked as shown above, 10" agove ground in rock collar. Steel post with signs 54-9 & 54-2 set next to cap.

Painted original bearing objects red.
