
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner established by W. B. Barr under GLO contract no. 355 dated June 14, 1880.

Surveyor General records state:

Marked basalt rock 15 x 19 x 5" for 4 Sec corner. Raised mound of rocks as per instructions.



Description of corner evidence found:

None, original corner probably destroyed by Forest road #77 construction.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At midpoint between Northeast and Southeast corners of sec 10 as determined by survey...

Set $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 23" in ground with 7" projecting out of ground with surrounding rock mound and 6' fence post along with signs 54-9.

New bearing trees established: A p pine 24" diam bears N27 $^{\circ}$ E, 101.4' dist marked 1/4811 BT. A p pine 17" diam bears N86 $^{\circ}$ W, 135.3' dist marked 1/4810 BT.

Each new BT has a band of red paint, painted blaze, a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush to BT blaze and signs 54-3 & 54-9 attached. Compass declination 20° East.

I hereby certify that the above described corner monument was properly reestablished by me and witnessed by Jim DeMastus on April 24, 1987.
