At the corner location I could not find the original stone this is a steep side slope and the stone might have rolled down the hill.

A 14" stump bears N45 $^{\circ}$ E at a distance of 5.3 ft marked BT also the tree is lying beside the stump marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S

The S 80 $^{\circ}$ W BT is an uprooted rotted tree marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

From the solid bearing tree stump and the root hole of the second B.T. I set a 2½x32" Brass capped steel pipe 18" in the ground in a large mound of stone from which;

An 8" Ponderosa Pine bears S86° 30' W 20.97 ft mkd ½ S 36 BT nail in S base


