## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION


History of original corner establishment: Corner established by Eugene P. McCornack under GLO contract no. 398 dated July 2, 1881.

Surveyor General records state:

Set post 3 ft long 3 ins square 24 ins in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec cor marked 1/4 S on N face from which;

A fir 20 ins diam bears S 45° E, 27 lks dist marked 1/4 S BT

A fir 8 ins diam bears S 45° W, 28 lks dist marked 1/4 S BT



Description of corner evidence found:

A 19 inch fir with healed blaze for section 12 bearing tree.

A fir stump 28 ins diam with BT scribe visible for other bearing tree. (NOTE: By using distance intersection for corner location it was found that the bearing to this tree should be S  $24^{\circ}$  E.)

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

At position established by distance intersection from the above described accessories set a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch aluminum cap on a 2 inch aluminum pipe 31 inches long and projecting 4 inches out of the ground with a surrounding rock mound. Placed a 6 foot steel fence post alongside with a sigh 54-9 attached.

Aluminum cap marked thus:

New bearing tree: A tamarack 9 ins diam bears N 77° E, 29.8 ft dist marked X BT and has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze.

Each bearing tree and stump has a sign 54-3 and sign 54-9 attached below a red band of paint around.
