
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## History of original corner establishment:

The corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick under Mineral Survey No. 477, during the survey of June and July 1902. The original notes state that at the corner a scribed slate rock, 24" by 18" by 12", was set 12" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone from which:

A 24" tamarack bears S59°10'W-27.33'. An 18" black pine bears N43°10'W-26.55'. Both marked B.T.A.4-T.S.1-477.



## Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 24" by 12" by 5" slate stone with an "X" on the top and chisel marks on the side, protruding 10" from the ground from which:

18" western larch stump bears  $S60\frac{10}{2}$ W-28.1' with catface (original bearing tree)

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the soriginal location of this corner:

et a 2½" by 30" aluminum pipe with a 2½" aluminum cap 10" in the ground to tock and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone. Buried original stone mound alongside the new monument. From the monument:

7" engleman spruce bears  $849^{\circ}W-9.0!$  scribed 4-A-1-TS-477 BT. 14" engleman spruc bears  $852\frac{1}{2}$  W-6.1' scribed 4-A-1-TS-477 BT.

bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to the face of bearing tree and painted face blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fence posts National Forest Boundary NW and SE of corner and attached sign 54-9 to post and sign 54-2 to both posts.

ted steel tape and staff compass with 20°E clination, measured to the center of the baring trees.

is corner was remonumented on August 14, 1985.
