Description of corner evidence found:

At the corner location I could find no evidence of the original stone. This is on a steep side slope and it may have rolled down the hill.

The S85° W BT is a standing live 18" Ponderosa pine with a partially healed over scar marked ½ S at a distance of 15.8 ft. The N20°E BT is a dead and down Ponderosa pine that has been transported by cat about 150 ft from its original position probably during road construction 50 ft East of corner

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

From the remaining solid BT I set a 2½"x32"
Brass capped steel pupe 20" in the ground in a mound of earth and rock from which:
A 6" White Fir bears \$16° E 23.73 ft
mkd ¼ \$ 33 BT nail in NE base
An 18" Ponderosa pine bears \$85° W 15.8 ft
mkd ¼ \$ BT Original B.T.

Distance pulled to 60d nail with Brass washer stamped LS 1898 driven in the side center of bearing trees
