
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

The corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick under Mineral Survey No. 477, during June and July 1902. The original notes state that at the corner a scribed tamarack post 4' long by 5" sq. was set 18" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth. From the post: A 24" red fir bears S1 13' W-23.46'. A 12" red fir bears N67 16'W-43.3'. Both marked B.T.B.Mt.W.C.-477.



Description of corner evidence found:

Found a mound of earth with rotted remains of the post in hole in center of mound from which:

A down, very rotten fir bears $S1\frac{1}{4}^{0}W-23.5'^{\frac{1}{2}}$ with fragmentary scribing and measuring nail. Could not attach signs due to the rotten condition.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 30" aluminum pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 24" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone from which:

An 8" white fir bears S75°E-7.9' scribed WEC-BM-477 BT.

An 11" white fir bears N25½°E-24.3' scribed WEC-BM-477 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to the face of blaze.

Attached sign 54-9 and 54-3 to each bearing tree and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fence post on claim line

North of corner and attached sign 54-9.

Used steel tape and staff compass with 20°E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on July 24, 1985.
