
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

'his corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick nder Mineral Survey No. 477, during June and July 1902. 'he original notes state that at the corner a scribed lack pine post 4' long by 4" sq. was set 12" in the round and surrounded with a mound of earth.



Description of corner evidence found:

cound the rotted remains of the original post lying beside an earth mound. Aso found the remains of the original post below ground.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

bet a 2½" by 30" aluminum pipe with a 2½" aluminum cap 26" in the ground ind surrounded with a mound of earth and stone from which:

10" white fir bears N83 $\frac{10}{6}$ E-42.3' scribed EEC-C-477 BT. 6" white fir bears S14 $\frac{1}{2}$ W-11.0' scribed EEC-C-477 BT.

bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to face of blaze. Ittached signs 54-3 and 54-9 to each bearing tree and painted face of blaze ind a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fence posts on National Porest Boundary NE and SW of corner and attached sign 54-9 to one post and the standard standard to both posts.

Jeed steel tape and staff compass with 20°E leclination, measured to the center of the pearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on August 28, 1985.

Mitness: John Tuttle

Placed remains of the original wood post on the new mound.
