
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Cor.No.4, Annululu Lode, identical with Cor.No.4 Chapman Lode, MS 382A

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was ESTABLISHED in 1899 by C.M.Foster, U.S. deputy mineral surveyor, as follows:

To cor.No.4. A pine post 4 ft long 4 ins square, set 18 ins in the ground scribed 4-382-A. whence, A pine 6 ins dia bears N73 W, 15.5 ft dist blazed and scribed 4-382-A, B.T.



Description of corner evidence found:

None.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At position determined by survey (see Record of Survey Plat filed separately for method of corner position reestablishment)...

Set 2" x 30" aluminum pipe with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " dia aluminum cap attached 25" in ground surrounded with a mound of earth & stone and placed 6' steel fence post alongside with signs 54-9 attached. Aluminum cap marked as shown to the right...

New bearing trees established:
A western larch 7" dia brs S83°W, 28.5' dist mkd A-4-C-4-382A BT.
A lodgepole pine 7" dia brs N33°E, 4.7' dist mkd A-4-C-4-382A BT.

Each new bearing tree has signs 54-3 & 54-9 attached below a surrounding 6" band of red paint and has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush to red painted blaze.

Compass declination 20° East.
