

Using the west-end center post location, the bearing tree being a 12" Spruce that bears \$490W, 9.8 ft., which is not monumented, and Mineral Survey No. 447 Rainbow Lode Corner 5, the location of this corner was reestablished. Set a 5/8" x 30" rebar with a 2" aluminum cap marked as shown above for the corner.
