A red fir tree 11 ins. in diam. blazed and scribed AMA.C.4-480 BT bears S84° 20'W (no distance given)

The mouth of tunnel No. 2 bears S76° 35'W, 448.5 ft.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found the rock mound and the post with scribing. The E" tamarack BT is gone. The 10" red fir might be there, did not have the notes for this BT while doing the work, but it may be a white fir. There is a white fir tree with a blaze scar of appropriate size and direction to be the 11 ins. red fir BT. It is 3 ft. from the rock mound.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Set a 5/8" x30" rebar with a 2" aluminum cap in the center of the rock mound for the corner. John Mitchell had placed a bearing tree tag on the suspected BT.
