

Found the rock mound and two Douglas-fir bearing trees which have grown to about 24". The 14" BT has been broken off and is now a stub about 6' high.

I set a $5/8" \times 30"$ rebar with a 2" aluminum cap marked as shown above in the center of the rock mound for the corner. John Mitchell had placed bearing tree tags on the two BTs.
