
History of original corner establishment:

Corner established by Wm. W. Elmer, U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, under instructions received from the United States Surveyor General for Oregon dated Oct. 23, 1906, and designated as Survey No. 679.

Surveyor General records state:

A pine post $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft long 4 ins square set $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft in the ground with a mound of earth and stone, scribed 1-679-A.

A pine 14 ins dia bears $N06^{\circ}W$ 21.5 ft, a pine 16 ins dia bears $S03^{\circ}25'E$ 21.9 ft, both blazed and scribed 1-679-A BT.



Description of corner evidence found:

No trace of original pine post.

A green pine 18 ins dia bears $N06^{0}W$ 21.5 ft with full scribes. A green pine 21 ins dia bears $S03^{0}E$ 21.9 ft with full scribes.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 30 ins long 25 ins in ground with 5 ins proj. out of ground with surrounding rock mound and 6 ft steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached.

Aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

Each original bearing tree has signs 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6 inch band of red paint.
