A yellow pine 12 ins dia blazed and scribed BRB 2-470BT bears 71.22°15'W 34.1 ft, a yellow pine 11 ins in diam blazed and scribed GRB 6-470 BT bears N44°20'W 13.6 ft dist.

Description of corner evidence found:

Corner position is at top of cut of old logging road spur, no evidence of original post or bearing trees.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a 2½" aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 30 ins long 20 ins in ground with 11 ins proj. out of ground with surrounding rock mound and 6 ft steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached.

Aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

New bearing trees established: A fir 6 ins dia bears NO10W 12.6 ft dist marked 2 BRB 470 BT.

A fir 8 ins dia bears N83°E 21.5 ft dist marked 2 BRB 470 BT.

Each new bearing tree has signs 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6 inch band of red paint and has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze.
