A white fir 10 ins dia bears N83°E 27 ft, both marked BR 1 MS 470 BT.

Corner was remonumented by: William L. Hanley, per Corner Record 9-37-120; dated March 14, 1986

Found monument set by John R. Mitchell.

A down portion of a douglas fir 10 ins dia bears N77°W 15.3 ft with fragmentary scribing. No evidence of other bearing tree.

Trees found by John R. Mitchell: A tamarack 12 ins dia bears N46*W 21 ft. A white fir 10 ins dia bears N83*E 27 ft.

Set a 2 1/2" aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 30 ins long 25 ins in ground with 5 ins proj. out of ground with surrounding rock mound and 6 ft steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached. Monument buried alongside north.

Aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

Each original bearing tree has sign 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6 inch band of red paint.


