Surveyor General records state:

Set a yellow pine post 4 ins square 4 1/2 ft long 18 ins in ground with a mound of rocks around it.

A yellow pine 16 ins diam bears N36 $1/2^{\circ}E$ 19.1 ft, a yellow pine 10 ins dia bears N07 W 23.5 ft, both blazed and scribed BR B C 4-470 BT.

Corner position remonumented by: John R. Mitchell in 1980 ... Set 2 1/2 ins brass cap on a 32" x 1" galv pipe in rock mound marked RM BR 4 MS 470.

Corner was remonumented by: William L. Hanley, per Corner Report 9-37-125; dated March 14, 1986.

Found monument set by John R. Mitchell.

A ponderosa pine 23 ins dia bears N36 $1/2^{\circ}E$ 19.1 ft with scribes visible. A ponderosa pine 16 ins dia bears N07 $^{\circ}W$ 23.5 ft with scribes visible.

Set a 2 1/2" aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 30 ins long 25 ins in ground with 5 ins proj. out of ground with surrounding rock mound and 6 ft steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached. Monument buried alongside north.

Aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

Each original bearing tree has signs 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6 inch band of red paint.


