At the point for the S-S 1/64 section corner of sections 5 and 6. 1 set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diameter, 21 ins. in the ground, and in a collar of stone, with brass cap marked:

A ponderosa pine, 17 ins. diameter, bears S. 67° E., a distance of 23.7 ft., marked SS I/64 S5 BT.


A ponderosa pine, 10 ins. diameter, bears S. 33 3/4° W., a distance of 19.8 ft., marked SS 1/64 S6 BT.

The corner is located in scattered fir and pine timber near the W edge of a deep ravine.

At the point for the 1/4 section corner of sections 5 and 6, as determined at proportionate distance, there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.



A ponderosa pine, 20 ins. diameter, bears S. 31 1/4° W., a distance of 40.2 ft., marked C S SW I/64 S5 BT.

A ponderosa pine, 10 ins. diameter, bears S. 80° W., a distance of 30.9 ft., marked X BT.

The corner is located on a steep W. slope which descends to a deep ravine.

- A railroad spike set in 1970 in the center of a paved road by James H. Hambleton (Baker County Survey No. 6-70), for the corner of sections 4, 5, 32, and 33. This spike was set using improper procedure and was not utilized by this survey.
- An iron rod set in 1970 by James H. Hambleton (Baker County Survey No. 6-70), for the west 1/16 section corner of sections 5 and 32. The firmly set iron rod, 5/8 in diameter, projects 1 1/2 ins. above the ground under a barbed wire fence which extends north and south. This monument was set from erroneous control and is not utilized by this survey.
- An iron rod set in 1970 by James H. Hambleton (Baker County Survey No. 6-70). The firmly set iron rod is 5/8 in. in diameter and projects 2 ins. above the ground. This monument was set from erroneous control and was not utilized by this survey.
- An iron rod, set in 1970 by James H. Hambleton (Baker County Survey No. 6-70), for the north 1/16 section corner of sections 5 and 6. The firmly set iron rod is 5/8 in. in diameter and 6 ins. below the surface of a gravel road. This monument was set by erroneous procedure and was not utilized by this survey.
- Corner No. 1 of Mineral Survey No. 18, recovered by James D. Hanley in 1977 (Baker County Survey No. 9-39-22), used in Baker County Survey No. 9-39-24, remonumented by person(s) unknown, date unknown, and used in Baker County Survey No. 9-39-58. The corner is monumented with an iron pipe, 1 1/4 in. diameter, which is firmly set and projects 12 ins. above the ground in a stone collar. Although this corner was originally set due west of the 1/4 corner, it is not on the section line and does not control alignment or corners on the section
