

## **NARRATIVE**

The purpose of this map is to record a partition of 3 parcels within Sally's Addition of the City of Baker in the SE1/4NE1/4 of Section 19, T9S, R40E, WM, Baker County, Oregon, which was surveyed and monuments set in 1983 by James Hambleton as shown on Baker County Map of Survey No. 9-40-198 and adjusted by me with additional monuments set on April 17, 1999, at the request of Dick Haynes.

In this locale of Baker City there are a number of metes and bounds described properties that overlay Sally's Addition. The primary reason seems to be that shape of the land does not conform well to a square grid subdivision. Many of the streets have been vacated because the land is too steep. The City of Baker City should vacate a portion of Sally's Addition as an undevelopable subdivision to eliminate underlying lines of the plat to the actual property lines. They are confusing and have no meaning.

The original plat of Sally's Addition was another early subdivision that lacked a great deal of data which is needed to establish property lines. More than likely the subdivision was not even surveyed and was strictly a paper plat using 1320—foot square forties. Jim Hanley came to this same conclusion as written in his narrative on Map of Survey No. 9-40-237. The only dimensions shown

on the Sally's Addition plat are the lot sizes with no bearings.

In 1954, James Hanley surveyed a dividing line through Block 7 which eventually was to represent the division between Parcels II(A-G) & III(A-C) as shown on this plat. Mr. Hanley did not show any bearings on Map of Survey No. 9-40-10 BC. It appears he assumed a theoretical 1320' quarter mile and made Grace and Tracy Streets perpendicular to the section line with Grace Street centered on the sixteenth line. Later surveys indicate most of these to be incorrect assumptions.

In 1973, the entire unit of land (which includes Blocks 2, 7, 10, 15 and 18, and the vacated streets and alleys through these blocks between Grace and Tracy Streets) shown on this plat was owned by Ralph Draeger and he had a survey done by James Hambleton which created 5 parcels of one to eight acres (Map of Survey No. 9-40-47BC). I have listed the parcel numbers as shown on the Hambleton plat in roman numerals with alphabetic suffixes to indicate additional breakdowns. There is a notation on this map of survey that Harry Swan did a survey of Parcel IV for Mr. Draeger in 1961, but there is no public record of such. Hambleton states on his plat that he could not find either of the Hanley monuments set in 1954. It is apparent that Hambleton also used the theoretical 1320' forty distance, but did not make the streets perpendicular to the section line.

The north—half of Section 19 was subdivided by Jim Hanley in 1977 and is recorded as Map of Survey No. 9—40—24. During the survey the NE one—sixteenth corner was set, but not the north one-sixteenth corner between Sections 19 & 20. Of the numerous surveys in this vicinity, I do not find any indication that the north sixteenth has ever been set even though it is a vital control to the adjacent lands and the location of Grace Street.

In 1983, Hambleton did another survey for James Day making Parcels II-B & II-C (Map of Survey No. 9-40-198). Parcel II-C was further monumented in such a way as to create Parcels II-D, E & F in the future. Parcel III-A and Parcel IV are in single ownership at this time. Parcels II-B (with III-C) & II-C are in single ownership as well. Monuments were set delineating the various parcels and land was sold based on these "original" monuments. On both of these surveys, Hambleton shows Grace Street not centered on the sixteenth line, but 20 feet to the north and 40 feet to the south. I could not find any documentation to support this action and apparently it is a reflection of the Harry Swan work. It is not apparent as to how Parcel III-C was created because Survey No. 9-40-198 show the monuments marking it as found, but this plat makes them of record.
Hambleton did not make any changes to his earlier survey to reflect the subdivision of Section 19.
In a 1987 Map of Survey No. 9-40-244, Hambleton does show Grace Street centered on the sixteenth line in Luchner's Addition at the NE one—sixteenth corner.

Another problem I found was the apparent ignoring of the legal principal that existing monuments control later surveys. In 1990, James Hanley did a partition survey for Parcels II—A and II—G (Partition No. P1990-007). During the Hanley survey, he shows as found many of the monuments set by Hambleton, but he did not use them to control the location of the east and west boundaries of the partition. I believe the north and south boundaries of the Hambleton parcels are questionable because of the location of Grace and Tracy Streets. I have shown the Hanley partition as dotted

lines to show its relationship to the original Hambleton surveys.

I have found all the monuments on Parcels II—D, E & F owned by Dick Haynes Trading LLC and are the subject of this partition plat. On the original plat of Sally's Addition, it appears that the addition was intended to be within the E1/2 of the NE1/4 of Section 19 and the streets were intended to equally spaced. This would cause the centerline of east—west streets to be located on the section's subdivisional lines. Therefore, I made a decision that the center of Grace Street should be the north sixteenth line through Section 19, which is consistent with Jim Hanley's findings and Baker City Surveyor Gary Van Patten's opinion. I set the N1/16th at the midpoint between the section and quarter corners with a hope this will stabilize the Grace Street location. I further set

new monuments on the north side of the three parcels 30 feet south of the center of Grace Street.

The original parcel has been described in Baker County Deeds No. 93—50—145.




