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Description of corner evidence found:

At approximate corner location found a stone marked 1/4 in place at base of fence corner from which the fence lines bear North, East and West.

It appears that this stone has been marked in a professional manner and is presumed that the original wood post corner monument has been remonumented by competent authority with no remonumentation record filed.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch brass cap on a 1 inch iron pipe 31 inches long and projection 6 inches out of the ground with a surrounding rock mound. Buried marked stone alongside.
