CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was established in 1904 by August W. Mohr deputy Mineral Surveyor.

Set was a post 5 in. sq. 3.5 ft. long set 18 in in the ground, surrounded by a mound of earth scribed 2-555 HF. from which:

DIAGRAM Harold F MS 555 645

a fir 30 in. in dia. bears N 69 E, 57.3 ft. scribed 2-555 HF BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

At the corner location I found a mound of stone with a post and two bearing trees. A 30 in. fir dead and rotted away with the blaze showing in the bark. Also a bearing tree with scribing 2-555 HF BT - no notes for this tree.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

The mound of stone and post agree to the original survey. Therefore, I set a 36 in. long 2 in. galv. iron pipe with a 2 in. brass cap in the ground with a mound of stone. Cap marked as shown in the diagram.

Old bearing tree:

a pine 24 in. dia. bears \$ 31 E, 3014 ft. scribed 2-555 HF BT.

New bearing tree:

a fir 10 in. in dia. bears N 68 30 E, 32.9 ft., scribed Harold F-2 MS 555 BT with a brass tag stamped LS 645. RECISTERED
