## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION


## History of original corner establishment:

Corner was established in 1904 by August W. Mohr deputy Mineral Surveyor.

Set a post 5 in. sq. 3.5 ft. long, set 18 in. in the ground with a raised mound of earth, scribed 3-555 HF from which:

a fir 18 in. in dia. bears N 75 E, 5 ft. scribed 3-555 HF BT.

a fir 5 in. in dia. bears \$ 86 W, 2 ft. scribed 3-555 HF BT.



## Description of corner evidence found:

At corner location I found a mound of earth and stone and an old rotted post, with one 32 in. fir with a blaze grown over. No other BT.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

As the evidence agrees with the original survey, I set a 36 in. long 2 in. galv. iron pipe with a 2 in. brass cap in the ground with a raised mound of stone. Cap marked as shown in the diagram.

New bearing tree:

a fir 9 in. dia. bears N 36 W, 8.0 feet, scribed Har. F-3-555 BT with a brass tag stamped LS 645.
