
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## History of original corner establishment:

The corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick under Mineral Survey 546 from January 7-11 of 1904. The original notes state that at the corner a marked Tamarack post, 4' long x 4" square was set 18" in the ground with mound of rocks from which:



A black pine 12" in diameter bears S  $50^{\circ}$  15'W 70.59'. Blazed and scribed BT A-4-546.

The corner was remonumented by Leland Myers in 1972.

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "xl" GIP set in mound of stones with remains of a wood post in mound from which:

A pine stump bears  ${\rm S41}^{\rm O}{\rm W}$  -70.2', with scribing visable on a portion of the bearing tree next to stump.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

The monument set by Myers was stabilized by rock. From Myers' monument:

A 8" spruce bears  $S71\frac{1}{2}$ °E  $-31\frac{2}{2}$ . A 8" lodgepole pine bears  $N87\frac{1}{2}$ °E  $-39\frac{2}{2}$ .

Each scribed A-4-C-1-546 BT.

Each new bearing tree has a brass washer stamped PLS1106 nailed to the face of the blaze. Attached signs 54-3 and 54-9 and painted face of blaze and a 6" red ring around each bearing tree.

Set steel fence posts Northwest and Southwest of corner and attached signs 54-2 to both posts and sign 54-9 to one post.

Used steel tape and magnetic staff compass with  $20^{\circ}$  East declination measured to center of bearing trees.

This corner was maintained on July 6,
