
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## History of original corner establishment:

The corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick under mineral survey No. 546 from January 7-11 of 1904. The original notes state that at the corner a marked red fir post, 4' long by 4" square was set 18" in the ground with a mound of earth from which:

A red fir 36" in diameter bears N44° 26'E 35.51'. A red fir 16" in diameter bears S 43° 08'W 21.04'. Each blazed and scribed BTA-E-C-546.



## Description of corner evidence found:

Found  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " alum cap on 1" GIP protruding 15" from mound of stones from which: A 32" white fir bears  $543\frac{1}{2}$ °W  $-20\frac{6}{1}$ ! with healed blaze.

## Description of manument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

The monument set by Myers was stabilized by piling rocks around it. From Myers' monuments:

A 6" white fir bears  $S42\frac{1}{2}$  E  $21\frac{6}{1}$  scribed A-E.C.-564 BT.

Each new bearing tree has a brass washer stamped PLS1106 nailed to the face of the blaze. Attached signs 54-3 and 54-9 and painted face of blaze and a 6" red ring around each bearing tree.

Set steel fence posts Northeast and Southwest of corner and attached signs 54-2 to both posts and sign 54-9 to one post.

Used steel tape and magnetic staff compass with  $20^{\circ}$  East declination measured to center of bearing trees.

This corner was maintained on July 6, 1983.
